## Executive Committee Meeting Summary March 16, 2016

- 1. Chairman Craig Hammer called the meeting to order and reviewed important dates found in the UHSAA Ready Reference Calendars (see <a href="www.uhsaa.org">www.uhsaa.org</a>). Academic All-State policy and deadlines were also discussed.
- 2. Ms. Linda Mayne provided a USOE report. She mentioned recent proposed bills regarding education that were entertained during the 2016 legislative session. She indicated that the legislature will fund the ACT test next March on the first Tuesday of the month for all juniors.
- 3. Mr. Rob Cuff provided the Committee with a list of winter state champions and a basketball endowment game financial report. The basketball endowment revenue this year is consistent with last year's revenue. The endowment money will be transferred to the Endowment Fund by a Board of Trustees motion next week. The endowment money is currently used to supplement schools' annual catastrophic insurance.
- 4. The UHSAA staff reviewed winter activities, which included wresting, basketball, drill team and swimming.
- 5. Mr. Jeff Cluff reviewed the winter ejection reports for coaches and players. The number of winter ejections were up slightly in comparison to past years. The emphasis in sportsmanship has helped the respect and relationships between coaches and officials improve.
- 6. The 2016-2017 tentative calendar (<u>www.uhsaa.org</u>) was discussed. Dates and sites for next year's UHSAA activities will be confirmed in the April meeting.
- 7. A reminder that the UIAAA Conference for athletic administrators is April 13-16 in St. George.
- 8. Ms. Kim Monkres congratulated all schools who participated in the Battle of the Fans competition during the basketball season. Hurricane High School was selected as this year's winner of the Battle of the Fans.
- 9. The UHSAA Dare2*LEAD* Student Leadership Conference will be held on June 16, 2016, at Murray High School. The staff is looking for 100% participation from member schools. Schools should submit the names of one boy and one girl using the link provided in the email sent to principals from the UHSAA.

- 10. Mr. Josh Taylor reported on Unified Sports in soccer and track & field. The UHSAA and SOUT (Special Olympics Utah) are once again joining together to provide this outstanding experience for student athletes.
- 11. Mr. Cuff reviewed the course titles from NFHS and provided the national website (www.nfhslearn.com) as a resource for education-based activities.
- 12. Mr. Josh Taylor discussed the new UHSAA App, Register My Athlete and the electronic submission procedures for the Academic All-State Award.
- 13. Mr. Cuff provided the Committee with articles reflecting the great things that are happening through education-based high school activities.
