UHSAA Endowment Games Policy & Procedures

- Endowment games must be approved by the UHSAA office at least 30 days prior to the game being requested. Endowment games at neutral sites will also require additional approval by the Executive Committee. Failure to do so may result in contest limitation violations.
- 2. In order for an endowment game to be approved, a digital ticketing gate through GoFan, must be charged for the game. Failure to do so will potentially result in reprimand/financial penalty by the Executive Committee.
- 3. No school time may be missed to participate in an endowment game. This includes travel time for all participants and support groups.
- 4. Participation in the endowment game is for the varsity level only. The game will not count toward the contest limitation for football.
- 5. Maximum hosting costs will be provided to the hosting school by the UHSAA for expenses from the gross receipts according to the chart below. Hosting costs do not include game fees and travel costs for referees. **These costs are paid by the UHSAA.** Travel costs for schools are the responsibility of the schools. After subtracting the hosting costs and the referee expenses from the gross receipts, 50% of the remaining net revenue shall be forwarded to the UHSAA Endowment Fund. The remaining 50% of net revenue will be forwarded to the hosting school. If gross receipts are less than the total expenses, the UHSAA will **NOT** reimburse schools to make up the difference. Administrators from the two schools should settle, **in advance**, issues of financing which may occur in excess of the hosting costs.

- 6. Student ID's and Region passes are **NOT** valid for admission to an endowment game. Only UHSAA issued Annual and Silver passes are valid for admission.
- 7. The game should run as though it were a Post-Season or a State Tournament Game. All ticketing will be done using the UHSAA ticketing platform GoFan. All ticket pricing for this game will be \$13.00 for adults and \$8.00 for students and senior adults 65 years and older.

 Ticket prices include the digital ticketing service fee. In the event your governing board or school district policy requires a secondary cash option for the game, the ticket pricing is the same as using the UHSAA ticketing platform GoFan, \$13.00 for adults and \$8.00 for students and senior adults 65 and older.
