## Disclosure Statement

A local school board shall require the development of activity disclosure statements for each school-sponsored group, club or program which involves students and faculty in grades 9 through 12 in contests, performances, events or other activities that require them to miss normal class time or take place outside regular school time.

The activity disclosure statements shall be disseminated to the students desiring involvement in the specific activity or to the students' parents or legal guardians or to both students and their parents.

An activity disclosure statement shall contain the following information:

- The specific name of the club, team, group or activity
- The maximum number of students involved
- Whether or not tryouts are used to select students, specifying date and time requirements for tryouts, if applicable
- Beginning and ending dates of the activity
- A tentative schedule of the events, performances, games or the other activities with dates, times and places specified if available
- If applicable, designation of any non-season events or activities, including an indication of the statue, required; expected, suggested or optional, with the dates, times and places specified if available
- Personal costs associated with the activity
- The name of the school employee responsible for the activity
- Any additional information considered important for the students and parents to know


## Policies and Procedures for Athletic Contests

## Administration

- Schools and individuals are subject to sanction by the Region 10 Board of Managers for any misconduct. The Region 10 Board of Managers reserves the right to discipline member schools and/or individuals according to the provisions of the current UHSAA handbook. (See Penalties)
- The principal or designee is responsible for the conduct and control of his/her school. The principal or designee should identify himself/herself to the host school prior to the start of the competition. Schools are advised to have adequate security for certain activities based on the needs of the school.
- Updated contact list of all coaches, administration, AD, etc. will be kept by individual schools and transferred to the Glide App used by Region.
- Failure to abide by Region rules and/or guidelines may result in the offending school, coach or advisor being disciplined. The Region 10 Board of Managers will determine the nature of the discipline. (See Penalties)
- All region schools declare which sports they are going to participate in at the beginning of the school year. No entry will be accepted after the starting of the sport. Unless there are more than $50 \%$ of Region 10 schools participating in UHSAA sanctioned activities, the Region will not sponsor that event.
- Moratorium: No practices or games may be scheduled during the officially established moratorium dates. A fine may be assessed to the offending school or directly to the coach if there is a violation as well as reported to the UHSAA. This fine is $\$ 300.00$ and is assessed to the coach of the sport in violation.(Reference the UHSAA Calendar for Moratorium Dates)
- The region will not financially support coaches meetings, unless previously approved.
- Individual coaches must contact their AD/Admin or Region Chairperson with specific questions. They can also reach out to the school overseeing the sport, but should not communicate with the region chair directly.


## Region Chair Duties:

1. Conduct all meetings pertinent to respective activity.
2. Coordinate and manage all region competitions and tournaments of respective activity.
3. Select (through individual sports policy) and honor respective All-Region teams where applicable.
4. Be a direct liaison to the Region Board of Managers.
5. Be responsible for all awards, trophies, medals, etc. pertinent to respective activity.

## Supervision at Region Events

- It is the responsibility of the host school to provide adequate general supervision for the activity.
- Visiting schools will provide supervision for football, basketball, and soccer.
- Any school hosting a region tournament or dual competition, for varsity, is responsible for providing adequate administrative supervision of the activity. There must be administrative supervision from the opposing school if there is a sponsored group of students from their school attending the activity.
- School administrators who are present at games agree to take immediate, definitive action towards disruptive or unsportsmanlike students or fans.
- It is the responsibility of the chair of each individual activity to see that region tournaments and meets are planned and well organized with region admission charged where appropriate(See Region Chair Duties)
- Forfeitures are to be approved by the Region 10 Board of Managers. However, during a game the officials have that authority.


## Failure to Participate:

The failure of a team to participate in a scheduled contest without prior mutual consent and board approval at all levels, including Basrity, J.V., Sophomore, Etc., will result in a fine of $\$ 100.00$ payable to the Region Board plus reimbursement for the cost of any officials.

## Number of Games:

Teams which exceed the number of games allowed in any season will forfeit from their region schedule the number of games exceeding the limit, beginning with game number one and proceeding on until the excess number is equaled. The Region Board of Managers may impose a fine or written reprimand for first infractions of this policy. The Region Board of Managers may
also impose suspensions if warranted. These instances will be handled by the Region Board of Managers case by case. It is the duty of the member school to notify the Region Board of Managers when this infraction has occurred. (See Penalties)

## Penalties:

Region 10 upon having knowledge of an infraction of a rule or policy in assessing penalties may initiate action. Region 10 Board of Managers may consider any of the following:

1. Forfeiture of contests of rules violations, etc.
2. Reprimand by official letter to individual(s) and/or school in regard to the offense committed with a warning to correct the situation(s).
3. Probation of individual(s) and/or school by official letter advising parties of the probationary status and the conditions of probation.
4. Restrictions which would restrict individual(s) and/or school in region, group of state activities.
5. Suspension would result in dropping the school from membership in region activities for a specified time period.
6. Fines to the coach, principal and/or school may be assessed.

All Penalties imposed by the Region 10 Board of Managers are final.

## Contest Limitations:

A. Definitions:

1. Contest: Any meet, game or competitive activity (including practices and scrimmages) in which one or more students participate, and at least one of whom is not a member of the student-body or the school sponsored program, counts toward the contest limitations listed below for that activity.
2. Tournament: Competition among four or more schools. B. The following contest limitations apply from the starting date of competition until the first day of the state tournament in each classification. This applies to all levels of competition (i.e., varsity, j.v., sophomore and freshmen). State qualifying tournaments do NOT count in the contest limitation totals for cross country, golf, swimming, tennis, track, wrestling, and speech/debate (see Charity and drill team exceptions below).
3. Baseball: 25 games. Each game played counts as one game.
4. Basketball: 23 games if no region post-season tournament is held. 21 games, at all levels, if post-season tournament is held. Each game played counts as one game.
5. Cross Country: 10 meets per individual. The UIAAA Cross Country Meet does not count toward the contest limitations.
6. Drill Team: 3 competitions and a region competition (total of four). The live practicum does not count toward the contest limitations.
7. Football: 9 games. One additional varsity contest is allowed for an approved endowment game but schools may not play alumni teams in a UHSAA endowment game. Each game played counts as one game.
8. Golf: 14 meets.
9. Lacrosse: 16 games. Each game played counts as one game. Each team can attend one tournament where they may choose one of two options: 1) Teams may play tournaments where two regulation-length games count as one (1) game, (2-for-1), with each game afterwards counting as one game, or 2) Teams may play tournaments where up to six (6) shortened-length games count as two (2) games, (6-for-2), with each game afterwards counting as one (1) game/ Teams may only use one (1) of these tournament exemptions in each season.
10. Soccer: 16 games. Each game played counts as one game. Each team is allowed to attend one tournament where they may play up to three games and count it as two contests toward the contest limit. A tournament must be sanctioned as per UHSAA guidelines and occur on consecutive days (excluding Sunday). If the tournament exceeds three games, any additional games would count "one for one" against contest limitations.
11. Softball: 22 games. Each game played counts as one game, except for the games played under the two-tournament exemption rule which allows schools two tournaments, at least one must be a non-school single day tournament, where all games played count as a single game (a maximum of four games may be played) and one multi-day tournament, where all games played count as two games (a maximum of eight games may be played in a multiple day tournament). If the maximum number of games is exceeded, in either tournament, each additional game would count "one for one" against contest limitations.
12. Swimming: 14 meets per individual.
13. Tennis: 16 matches per individual. The number of matches counted for a tennis tournament (competition among four or more schools) shall be equal to the number of days scheduled for the tournament; e.g., a one-day tournament shall count as one match, a two-day tournament shall count as two matches, etc.
14. Track: 12 meets per individual. An individual may participate in no more than eight (8) qualifying meets in addition to the region meet.
15. Volleyball: One of the following three options may be chosen: 16 matches and 0 tournaments; 15 matches and 1 tournament; or 14 matches and 2 tournaments. The following guidelines pertain to the tournaments: no more than 9 total matches in a tournament, no more than 7 matches in a given day; and tournaments may not exceed three days in length. If a region tournament is held it would have to be counted as one of the two tournaments allowed.
16. Wrestling: Each high school team will be able to utilize 16 contact points. Each dual meet will count as one contact point. Each tournament will count as one contact point. Teams will not be able to compete in more than 6 tournaments before the post-season qualifying and state tournaments. Teams may not compete in more than 3 dual meet style tournaments.
17. Music: 3 contests per category.
18. Speech: 10 meets per individual.

## Athlete Eligibility

- Eligibility of participating students must follow guidelines of the current UHSAA handbook. Individual districts may add to the guidelines but may not subtract from them.
- Only full time students may be considered eligible to compete in interscholastic competition as deemed by the school district. Exceptions include alternative school eligibility and home/private school student participation.
- Students must earn a minimum of 2.0 GPA in the grading period previous to participation. Students also cannot fail more than one subject in the proceeding grading period.
- To establish academic eligibility for $1^{\text {st }}$ term of a new school year, $4^{\text {th }}$ term grade deficiencies must be made up in the same subject area by attending summer school, night school or by any other method acceptable to and by the deadline prior to the $1^{\text {st }}$ term of the preceding year and shown on the student's transcript.
- During the school year ( $2^{\text {nd }}, 3^{\text {rd }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ terms), make up can only be done during the next quarter. For example, a student who fails multiple classes 1st term cannot do alternative school to make up the class and become eligible prior to the end of 2nd term.
- Eligibility will be determined on the day grades are posted.
- An Incomplete (I), no grade (NG), and no credits (NC) are considered failures (F) until made up.


## Activity guidelines

- For all varsity events, the host school will provide someone to meet the bus and direct the visiting team to the locker room. Schools should also inform bus drivers where visiting team buses are to park. Dressing rooms should be appropriately prepared for visiting teams with a clean area, lockers, showers, taping tables and whiteboard. A key or a representative with a key will be provided for the visiting team for access to the dressing room. If a key is issued, the visiting team must return it to the head coach or athletic director of the host school before departure.
- All students are expected to respect the facilities of the host school. Facilities will be opened to visiting schools one hour prior to the event start time. Flexibility is requested due to the distances we travel within the region. Visiting teams should quickly leave the court and field after each contest.
- Visiting Teams should respect the host school and stay in assigned areas. Please do not wander the halls and other areas.
- All schools must provide their own towels. Mat towels and first aid materials must be provided by the host school.
- All schools are responsible to bring their own locks and/or means of securing valuables. It is not the host school's responsibility to secure valuables. Students are urged not to take excessive amounts of valuables with them in order to avoid potential problems.
- All schools are expected to provide competent or adult scores, timers, chain crew for all varsity events. These personnel and all others who assist are officials and not spectators in their behaviors.
- Coaches should supervise locker rooms to ensure the safety, security and proper decorum. All dressing room facilities must be left in a clean and orderly manner. The visiting head coach will check facilities prior to departure of the visiting team and report violations to the host administrators.
- The host schools will provide an area from which to film and/or coach.
- All media needs to get prior approval from the principal or designee before broadcasting an event.
- The home team is responsible for score reporting, specifically MaxPreps.


## Prohibitions

- We support the guidelines issued by UHSAA concerning support items, in the state handbook. Drums are to be used only as part of the pep band, before the game, at the end of each quarter, at half-time, and official time-outs.
- No physical contact is allowed between opposing schools' mascots.
- Fans in the student section are not allowed to sit on the front row or stand on the floor in the gymnasium.
- Shirts must be worn at all times.
- The use of laser pointers is forbidden at all region events. The laser pointer will be confiscated and the spectator will be ejected from the event.
- Spectators are not allowed on playing fields or courts at any time, including halftimes and before and between games. After the game, no one will be allowed on the floor or field until visiting teams and officials have safely exited.
- Children under high school age are discouraged from being on the sideline, court or playing field.
- No masks or mask-like paintings are allowed. We need to be able to identify individual students.
- No Cow-Bells, Speaker Phones, Megaphones or noise making machines are allowed at any contest.


## Sportsmanship

- Each student body is to exhibit good sportsmanship. The administrators and advisors are, in the interest of proper education, to stress positive sportsmanship and do all in their power to eliminate booing, catcalls or unsportsmanlike behavior.
- Coaches are responsible for the conduct of their athletes. No team or individual activity will be conducted to belittle or humiliate opponents, including violating the warm up area of the opposing team, organized post-game demonstrations on an opponent's floor or field. Infractions will be referred to the Region 10 Board of Managers for appropriate action.
- Racism will not be tolerated by our Region. We will follow the UHSAA policy in regards to discipline for member schools whose students, fans/patrons or players engage in such behavior. The Region 10 Board of Managers expects that if racist or derogatory comments are being made that the host schools administration will stop the contest and make an announcement to the entire student section or crowd that this behavior won't be tolerated. Removal of fans, parents/patrons or players is at the discretion of the host administration/athletic director and should be considered if the situation warrants it.
- A well-planned flag ceremony should be encouraged prior to the start of the event.
- Schools are encouraged to read a sportsmanship statement at all varsity athletic activities (example below):
"Ladies and gentlemen, welcome to $\qquad$ High School for (today's event). We welcome our guests from $\qquad$ and
wish all players good luck in tonight's game. Both schools are members of the Utah High School Activities Association and support the statewide sportsmanship program Raise-the-Bar. Tonight's game features the
$\qquad$ versus $\qquad$ ! The Utah High School Activities Association encourages respect for all fans and participants tonight. Take the time to respect all who are attending and participating in this education-based activity setting. Respect others and expect to receive respect from others. Be inclusive in your behavior and Do Rowdy Right. Thank you for your cooperation and enjoy the game."


## It is recommended that a flag ceremony/National Anthem be conducted at each event where possible.

* Activity should remain suspended until the flag ceremony is over including ticket and concession sales and entry to the event.
- Post-game celebrations on the court or field are discouraged in order to avoid conflict and to show respect and positive sportsmanlike conduct.
- After contests, the visiting team should exit the floor or field immediately.
- Team post-game talks should be held in the locker room (but must be brief), or on the bus. For Football, teams may choose to come out of the locker room at half with all their gear. That way when the contest is over, team meetings can happen on the field, on the visitors side. This decision will be left up to individual schools/teams.
- Defacement or improper behavior may result in sanctions by the Region 10 Board of Managers in accordance with the UHSAA policies and procedures outlined in the current UHSAA handbook.


## Scheduling

- A change of time or date of an activity may be affected only through inclement weather or unplayable fields or mutual agreement of both schools' principals/athletic directors. The host school must notify the arbiter of the change in time to notify officials.
- In case of calendar scheduling conflicts, region and varsity events take precedence over non-region events, non-varsity and practice in other activities.
- Spring Break Schedule Changes: Must be a mutual agreement of the schools' principals/athletic directors. Changes for spring break must be done before the sports start date.
- All dates in this handbook are subject to change. Any date changes only require approval by the affected schools and do not need to be approved by the Board of Managers.
- Region schedules will be created with League Scheduler, at random, and given to member schools. There are some sports where League scheduler will not be used due to scheduling issues and region formats.


## Officials

- UHSAA arbiter or an approved association will assign officials for league events. Encouragement is given to local qualified people to participate in officiating through their local approved association.
- UHSAA arbiter will be used to assign all VARSITY contests in football, girls' and boys' basketball, girls' and boys' soccer, baseball, softball and wrestling.
- Host schools will arrange for all officials.
- All officials will be paid according to rates established by the UHSAA office.
- Host schools will provide for someone to meet officials and show them to their dressing rooms both before and after any event. Any misconduct of officials, including failure to show up or tardiness, is to be reported to the region chairperson in charge of the involved activity. A detailed report including names and improper conduct shall be submitted in writing to the UHSAA office and to the arbiter involved.


## DETERMINATION OF REGION CHAMPIONS AND PLACEMENT FOR

 STATE TOURNAMENT
## Tie-Breaker Rule - The UHSAA RPI ratings will solve the majority of the tie-breaker situations as it relates to state tournament seeding. For those sports not using RPI, an established tie-breaker scenario is found in the sport specific guidelines.

- Ties in win-loss records between teams for first place will result in Region Co-Champions being declared and duplicate trophies will be awarded.
- Sports conducting a region tournament or meet will determine a region champion using established criteria found in the sport specific guidelines.


## All Region and Academic All Region Awards

- All Region Awards will follow the guidelines set in the sport specific guidelines
- MVP's are voted on by the coaches
- Academic All-Region selection will be varsity senior participants with a 3.75 or higher cumulative GPA that have been nominated for Academic All State. Schools will present their own awards. Region 10 Certificates are available for use by the schools.


## Appeals Process

- The Appeals Process for perceived violations of Region rules, ethics or fairness is as follows:
a. Attempts to mutually resolve the issue between the involved schools' representatives.
b. Referral to the Region representative over the activity for mediation.
c. Referral to the Region Chair to facilitate a Region Board of Managers' resolution or decision.
d. If the above steps do not provide satisfactory results as deemed by the Region Board of Managers, UHSAA mediation and support will be sought to give judgment or direction regarding the matter.


## Region Events

Schools hosting region events are responsible for all costs associated with the event including the payment of officials and judges. Schools will then submit reimbursement from the region with an itemized invoice detailing the expenses incurred. This will make sure that we are paying vendors and officials promptly.

Default start times for region events are 3:30 PM unless otherwise noted.

## Region Revenues

- Region Dues: \$3,500
- Region Activity Admission Fee Schedule:
$\$ 7.00=$ per ticket including transaction fees
Free $=$ Senior Citizens 62 and over and children 5 and under when accompanied by an adult $=$ free
- Tickets will be sold at varsity football; all levels of volleyball; basketball; wrestling matches and region drill at the above region prices.
- Money for state playoff games will follow state guidelines.
- During region tournaments, all admissions will be by ticket only. Team members, managers, bus drivers, cheerleaders, and coaches will be admitted free into region tournaments. Drill team members and band members will be admitted with a uniform only.
- There will be a limit of 50 Region Activity passes issued to each school. The region chair should give region passes to the district administration, transportation department, junior high principals, maintenance department and others deemed necessary.
- Student Government Officers with sweater or jacket with ID will be allowed into region contests free.


## Baseball

Games will be played on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays

Tuesdays will be a Varsity/ JV DH at Team \#1

- Drill team members and cheerleaders in uniform with advisors will be admitted to the game without charge. Each group must have an advisor present during performances.
- Placement of Pep Squad, Cheerleaders and Drill Team and visiting fans is at the discretion of the host school. Schools should locate the cheerleaders in the safest, most practical areas of the court side. Shared time on the court needs to be coordinated between Captains prior to games. Cheerleaders may not be in the foul lanes extended under the basket and should stand outside the extended lines.
- Maximum number of cheerleaders(on the floor) for certain sports:
- Basketball $=12$
- Volleyball = 8
- Wrestling = 8
- There are to be NO derogatory/obscene signs or cheers. Region 10 supports cheering for your own team and not against the opposing team. No singling out individuals or heckling, etc., (including parents, referees, players, etc). Only constructive, positive signs and posters may be used.
- Megaphones are to be used only by official cheerleaders for communication with cheering sections only in football. There will not be megaphones allowed in the gymnasium during competition.
- Cheerleaders are to cheer only positive cheers during free throw shooting.
- Drill teams will not expect to march at visiting schools unless invited or by mutual agreement with the host school.

- Cheerleaders will observe all state or district guidelines for pyramids and stunting.
- Football half-time: Performing groups have ten (10) minutes which includes time to get on and off the field. Exceptions can be made by mutual agreement for special occasions.
- Basketball half-time: Maximum of seven (7) minutes for half-time entertainment which includes time to get on and off the floor. Exceptions can be made by mutual agreement for special occasions.
- Pep band will be provided by the host school only. Exceptions by mutual agreement. During basketball games, pep bands are to play during regulation time-outs, quarters and half-time only. An advisor must always be present if a band is to perform. Drums are to play only as part of the pep band or as accompaniment to a cheer by the cheerleaders.
- Host school will provide all music which includes, but is not limited to: pre-game, time outs, inning breaks, walk up music, etc. Visiting team will not bring music without prior approval.

6. JV Duel Match Scoring is as follows: Each foursome is competing for 5 total points. There will be 4 foursomes in a match, 8 players per team. Individual Head to Head stroke Play = 1 Point (\#1 v \#1, \#2 v \#2, etc.) Individual Match Play = 1 Point (\#1 v \#1, \#2 v \#2, etc.) Team Match Play = 1 Point (\#1 \& \#2 v \#1 \& \#2, etc.) In case of a tie, points will be split among the teams.
7. Individual medals will be given to the 10 players with the lowest total score for 18 -hole region tournaments played. A player must play in all region varsity events (can drop one low score or miss one) and the Region Championship to be eligible for top 10. All scores in the Region Championship will count (cannot be dropped). Awards will be given to all region medallists.

15. ALL UHSAA Golf Championships (boys and girls) will use a Maximum Stroke Play Scoring System. Contestants will PICK UP after reaching a maximum score of 9 strokes on any hole of a competition.

Markers will record a 9 on any hole where the maximum score is scored and then it will be circled on the card for easy identification of that score.
b.

All designated or sanction Region Events should also use this scoring system. It will provide consistent and fair qualification for the state competitions and All-State considerations.
c.

Advantages of using this system are increased speed of play and less pressure to finish a very bad hole. This system will also use the modification for Penalties and Disqualification Penalties that are listed under USGA Rules of Golf; Rule 32 Bogey, "Par and Stableford Competitions". Please review these prior to the start of the golf season.

## TRACK \& FIELD GUIDELINES

## Regular Season Region Meets

1. Track \& field meets will begin at $3: 30$.
2. Any changes in the region schedule (see below) must be approved by the administration and/or athletic director of the affected schools and communicated to the region chairperson over track and field. The host school's principal will determine whether a meet should be canceled.
3. At dual/tri region meets, the host school will be responsible to conduct and take care of all preparation and equipment needs.
4. Visiting schools will run assigned event(s) at region dual/tri meets.
5. Each school will furnish their own adhesive finish tags for region meets.
6. Athletes can participate in no more than 12 meets. Only 8 of the 12 can be qualifying meets, plus the region and state meet. (Consult the UHSAA website for any updates or changes.)
7. Order of events for one-day dual/tri meets is provided below.

## Region Championship Meet

8. Qualifying for state through the Region Championship Meet will follow the state guidelines. Currently that means the top four (4) finishers in each individual event and the top four (4) finishers in each relay will qualify for the state meet. (Consult the UHSAA website for any updates or changes.)
9. Medals will be awarded to the top six (6) finishers at the Region Championship Meet in each individual event. One medal will be awarded to each member of the top three (3) relay teams for both girls and boys relay events.
10. Each school will provide two adult volunteers to help run events at the Region Meet.
11. The Region will pay for a head starter and four other officials at the Region Meet.
12. The winner of the region trophy will be determined by team scores at the Region Meet.
13. Scoring at the Region Championship Meet will be as follows: 10,8,6,5,4,3,2,1 points for individual events and 10,8,6,5,4,3 for relays.
14. Each school will be allowed five (5) individuals at the Region Championship Meet in each individual event, unless a school has more than five (5) individuals that are already qualified for State, in which case all qualified individuals may be entered. Each school will be allowed one (1) scoring relay team in each relay event.
15. Tie-breaking protocol will follow the NFHS rule book per the event. If, after applying the protocol, a tie still remains, the points will be divided between the tied athletes' teams. If a clear differentiation is required (like for a 4th place finish to determine state qualification), then a "run-off" or "jump-off" protocol will be used, and the points will be awarded to each team based on the athletes' final placement.
16. Order of events at the two-day Region Meet will follow the schedule outlined below (based largely on the state meet), unless otherwise agreed upon.
17. At the Region Championship Meet all athletes must be in uniform, which consists of a school-issued track and field top and bottom. (See federal handbook Rule 4, Section 3, Article 1-4)
18. The host school will act in the role of the meet director

## All-Region Status

19. All-Region athletes will be recognized by each team at their own awards event (like a banquet) rather than at the region championship meet.
20. For Individual Events: All-Region First Team status will be awarded to the top four (4) finishers in each individual event at the Region Championship Meet. All-Region Second Team status will be awarded to the 5th and 6th place finishers in each individual event at the Region Championship Meet. And All-Region Honorable Mention status will be awarded to the 7th and 8th place finishers in each individual event at the Region Championship Meet.
21. For Relay Events: All-Region First Team status will be awarded to the first place team in each relay event. All-Region Second Team status will be awarded to the second place team in each relay event. All-Region Honorable Mention status will be awarded to the third \& fourth place teams in each relay event.
22. For Academics: Academic All-Region status will be awarded to senior varsity athletes who have a cumulative GPA of 3.7 or higher.

- Each team will choose 2 players.
