Recommended Selection Criteria

- Each UHSAA member school should select two juniors, one boy and • one girl, to attend the conference.
- Select students that are positive role models in the school and are active in UHSAA sports and/or activities.
- The students should be respected by their teachers, peers, teammates and demonstrate leadership abilities, academic excellence, strength of character, and personal responsibility.
- The students have the desire and ability to positively influence and • impact their peers, school and community.

- In May, the UHSAA will e-mail an invitation to the students selected to attend the conference. •
- The cost of the conference is \$25 per student, which includes the **Dare 2 Lead** conference t-shirt, conference materials, continental breakfast and lunch. The UHSAA will invoice each school for the cost of their attendees.
- The conference will be held on Thursday, June 14, 2018 at Jordan High School (95 Beetdigger Blvd.) from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and include team-building, break-out sessions and a service project.
